American watchmaker Bozeman has released its most complicated watch and designed it specifically for the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association in support of their Olympic success. The Bozeman Watch Company is also the official watch and timing company of the U.S. Ski Team.

The SnowMaster Telemetric features five functions that keep track of speed and distance with a chronograph, a second time zone and a telemetric scale that helps measure the distance traveled at a chosen rate of speed. The user can also track land and air speed based on units of travel within an identified period of time. The watch features a tachymeter scale on the dial to determine the rate of speed using a base of one mile. Made with an automatic ETA Valjoux movement that is COSC-certified, the watch comes in a stainless steel case measuring 43 mm.

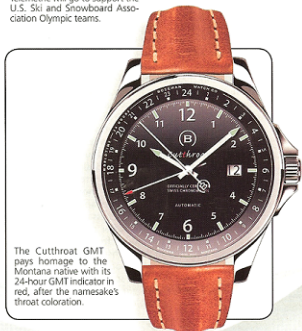
Last year, the Montana-based company issued the Cutthroat, named after the trout that is the only one native to Montana. Fly-fishermen can keep track of time with the GMT function as they try to catch this elusive trout swimming the blue-ribbon streams in the Montana region. Bozeman has been instrumental in supporting a Congressional bill to pass the largest watershed preservation act, the Snake River Watershed.

On this watch, the tip of the 24-hour indicator is red, the same as the throat coloration on the trout. This watch is COSC-certified and comes in a 42-mm stainless steel case that is water resistant to 100 meters. It can come with a tan or black saddle leather strap or brushed and polished stainless steel bracelet.

The Bozeman watch company is currently the only American watch firm that sends each of its ETA mechanical movements to Geneva for chronometer certification by the COSC.
